Reflections of 20 years of Wildlife Research

Dr. Rittenhouse and her labgroup study where animals live, movements animals make when traveling through habitats, and why wildlife populations persist in some locations and not others. She will use examples from current projects, including animal movement of bobcats and mallards in an exurban landscape and ranavirus epidemics within wood frog populations, to highlight lessons she has learned over the last 20 years of wildlife research.
